

1. The meeting was called to order by Karen Cunningham at 7 PM.
2. Introductions were made of those present.
3. Steven Cary, District Director for Congressman Charlie Crist spoke about the ability that his office has to work with constituents throughout the 13th Congressional District.
4. Secretary, Sean Schrader mentioned that the October Minutes had been posted on the website, and there were no questions/comments regarding the minutes. Bill Jonson moved to approve the minutes, and Linda Kubilius seconded the motion to approve the minutes.
5. Treasurer, Shelly Kuroghlian mentioned that there had been minimal changes to the CNC finances in both accounts. Glenna Wentworth moved to approve the minutes, and Linda Kubilius seconded the motion.

7. Officer Heredia, Clearwater Police Department discussed that both robberies and burglaries have decreased. He encouraged those present to hide packages that will be delivered outside, in order to ensure porch pirates do not steal packages.
8. Juliahna Green, Clearwater Neighborhoods Coordinator mentioned several new city programs that have been created to promote neighborhood involvement: The Storm Drain Mural Project, the Little Free Library Program, and the Dumpster Mural Program. She also mentioned that the CRA recently launched the Urban Conga program, a series of lectures to help guide neighborhoods in creating more events that promote community engagement.
9. Glenna Wentworth spoke to those present regarding the recent Sustainability Program that the CNC hosted in conjunction with several other organizations. She discussed that there were several speakers who gave in-depth information regarding how communities and neighborhoods can practice sustainability throughout Clearwater.
10. Doug Williams, former CNC Treasurer and long-time CNC Member gave a brief presentation about the history of the CNC.
11. Roberta Klair, representative to the Clearwater Arts Alliance encouraged those present to have involvement from neighborhoods throughout Clearwater, in order to help spread/create unique identities for neighborhoods through art work.
12. Kathleen Agnew and Mary Ellen Lansburg presented the proposed slate of officers for the 2020 Term. The vote to approve the Slate will take place at the December CNC Meeting.
